## Summary of *Additional* Amendments Made in Order to the Further Consideration of H.R. 2586 - The National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2002

The following are summaries of the additional amendments made in order to today's further consideration of the Defense Authorization bill. In plain text is the language of the summaries as provided by the Rules Committee. In ***bold italics*** are RSC additions to the summaries. In parentheses are the times for which each amendment is debatable.

### Manager's Amendment –

- Allows the Secretary of Defense to accept monetary contributions for the purpose of repair and reconstruction of the Pentagon ***damaged by the terrorist attack of September 11, 2001.***
- Increases ***by \$10.0 million (by offset from consulting funds)*** operation and maintenance for nonproliferation and verification R&D within the National Nuclear Security Administration.
- Preserves the authority of the Director of Central Intelligence for space reconnaissance and other national intelligence purposes intelligence purposes.
- Expresses a sense of Congress that DOD should provide appropriate public safety and security for the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, Utah.
- ***Increases by \$57.1 million (by offset from consulting funds) the amount provided for shipbuilding and conversion for the Navy.***
- Increases the existing F-22 engineering and manufacturing cost cap.
- ***Increases by \$30.0 million (by offset from consulting funds) the authorization for Air Force Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation.***
- Extends the reporting requirement and termination dates for the Commission of the Future of the United States Aerospace Industry.
- Adjusts assumed savings of the sale of stockpile material.
- Clarifies the authorities of the Secretary of Defense with regard to the Department of Defense Medicare-Eligible Retiree Health Care fund.
- Clarifies that the Military Treatment Facilities are included in the trust fund calculations and set the normal cost contribution for any year to be equal to the trust funds outlays for that year.
- Strikes current provisions in the bill on A-76 workforce studies and replaces with temporary limits and requires projected cost savings thresholds (***10%***) to be met before proceeding.
- Authorizes the Secretary of the Army to lease a limited number of housing units within the Presidio of San Francisco. (10 Minutes)

### Stump –

- Expresses a sense of Congress recognizing the importance of civilians in support of the Armed Forces worldwide.
- Commends the DOD decision to create a new medal for the defense of freedom to be awarded to civilians employed by DOD who are killed or wounded as a result of hostile action.
- Urges the Secretary of Defense to move expeditiously to produce and award the new medal and to develop a more comprehensive, uniform policy for the award of decorations to military and civilian personnel. (10 minutes)

### Traficant –

- *Allows the Secretary of Defense to assign*, at the request of the Attorney General *or* the Secretary of the Treasury (*whichever is appropriate*), military personnel to assist *the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) and the U.S. Customs Service (USCS)* in patrolling our borders *through the end of fiscal year 2004*.
- *Such assignment may be for “preventing the entry of terrorists and drug traffickers into the United States...and the entry of weapons of mass destruction, components of weapons of mass destruction, prohibited narcotics or drugs, or other terrorist or drug trafficking items.”*
- *Requires that assigned military personnel be accompanied by appropriate civilian authorities and that such military personnel be properly trained by a joint DOD-INS or DOD-USCS program, as appropriate.*
- *Authorizes* the establishment of a task force by either the Treasury Department or the Justice Department for the purpose of counter-terrorism and drug interdiction, *when certified as necessary by the President*. (10 minutes)

Sanchez – *Allows currently-prohibited abortions* at overseas military hospitals. (10 minutes)

### Stump/Skelton –

- Creates a new Title related to activities to combat terrorism.
- Provides \$400 million in funding for intelligence (*\$100 million*), anti-terrorism (*\$150 million*), counter-terrorism initiatives (*\$100 million*), and *“consequence management activities”* (*\$50 million*) through *offsets from* funding for National Missile Defense programs (*\$265 million*) and consulting services (*\$135 million*).
- Requires an assessment of DOD’s ability to respond to terrorist attacks, a report on protection from airborne threats, and the establishment of combating terrorism as a national security mission.
- *Requires the Secretary of Defense to establish coordination roles with the FBI and FEMA for responses to crises*. (40 minutes)
