


Total Labor/HHS/Education Spending




- The President's request for FY '03 is \$6.6 billion or 5.3% above last year.

- If Congress enacts the President's request, total Labor / HHS / Education spending will have increased by \$20.7 billion or 18.8% since the last election.


- If Congress enacts the President's request then since taking control of Congress, Republicans will have increased total Labor / HHS / Education spending by 94%. No other appropriations bill even comes close to having doubled since 1996.

Department of Education Spending In the Labor/HHS/Education Bill



- The President's request for FY '03 is \$1.8 billion or 3.7% above last year.
- If Congress enacts the President's request, Department of Education spending will have increased by \$10.2 billion or 25.5% since the last election.
- If Congress enacts the President's request then since taking control of Congress, Republicans will have increased Department of Education spending by 136% -- more than double the amount of money provided in 1996.

Dep. of Health & Human Services Spending In the Labor/HHS/Education Bill




- The President's request for FY '03 is \$5.2 billion or 9.7% above last year.

- If Congress enacts the President's request, Department of HHS spending will have increased by \$10 billion or 20.4% since the last election.

- If Congress enacts the President's request then since taking control of Congress, Republicans will have increased Department of HHS spending by 101% -- more than double the amount of money provided in 1996.


Department of Labor Spending In the Labor/HHS/Education Bill



- The President's request for FY '03 is \$0.85 billion or 7.0% below last year.
- If Congress enacts the President's request, Department of Labor spending will have decreased by \$0.6 billion or 5.0% since the last election.
- If Congress enacts the President's request then since taking control of Congress, Republicans will have increased Department of Labor spending by 21% .

Defense and Labor/HHS/Education Spending


Increase from 1996 to 2003***

Increase in Certain Departments Since Republican Takeover of Congress *FYs 1996-2003***


