
The decision of the National Right to Life Committee (NRLC) to include the Medicare Prescription Drug and Modernization Act as a key pro-life vote on your Congressional scorecard is of grave concern to us. We believe scoring this vote sends the wrong message to our constituents, and yours. A consistently pro-life Member of Congress who chooses to vote against the Medicare bill should not appear to be less than 100% pro-life, according to NRLC. While many of us disagree on the merits of the Medicare reforms contained in the bill, we agree that this vote does not indicate a position on life.

We have consistently voted pro-life and stand unwavering in defense of all life. We respectfully ask that you reconsider your decision to score this vote to avoid the detrimental message it will send to the pro-life community.


